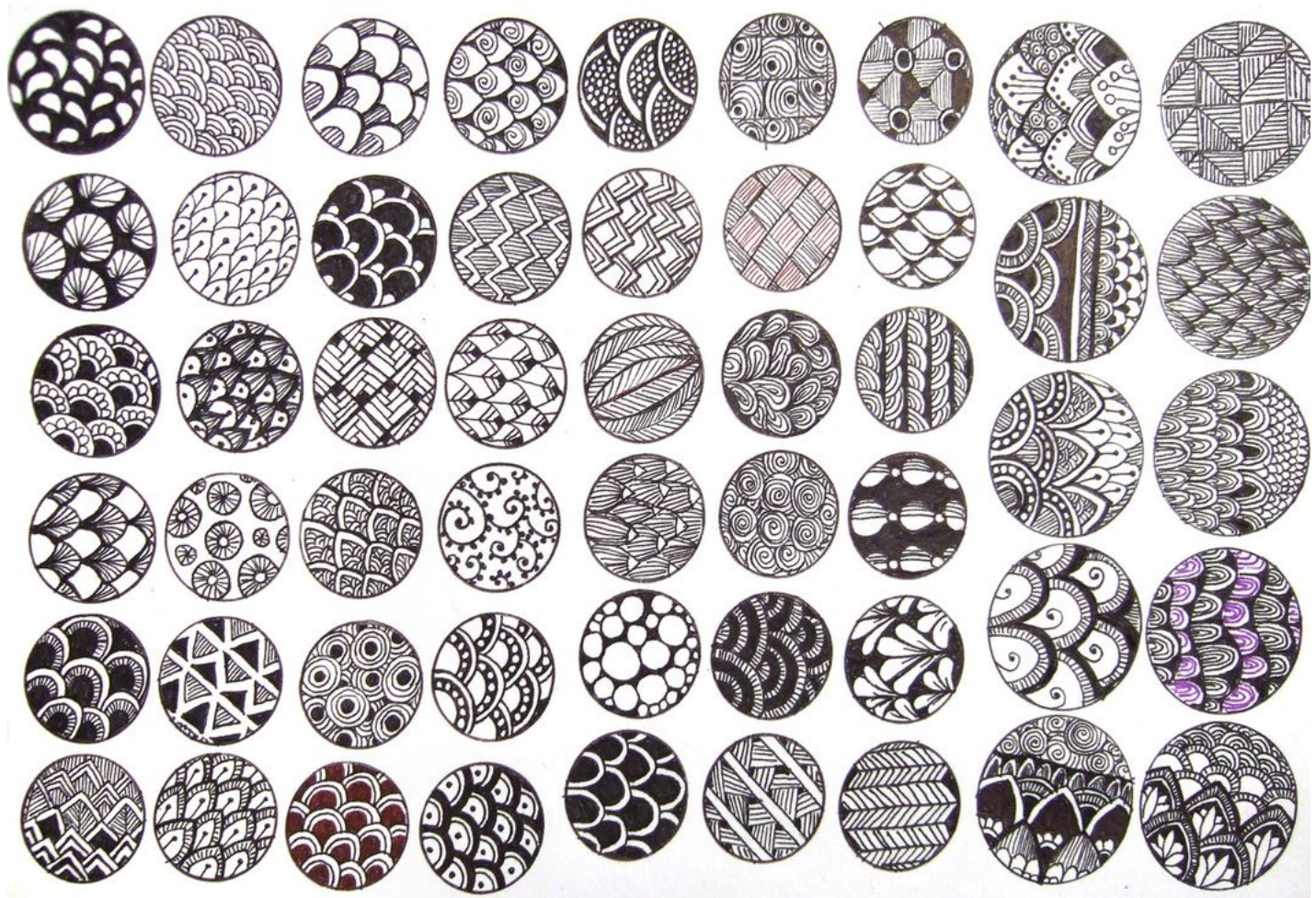
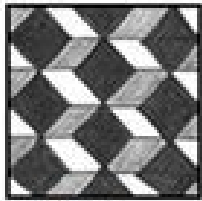


Uncover the Artist Within Your Child

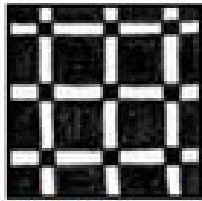

Zentangle is all about drawing or doodling patterns – in a repetitive manner and then expanding it to put together a piece of art or in this case the cork coasters. The repetition of patterns – in an imaginative, neat and clutter-free way – makes this art form very soothing, beautiful and fun to look at – for the artist as well as the viewer.

Below are some samples of Zentangle art, yet explore your many options and check it out online! You can find how to step by step instructions for different patterns!

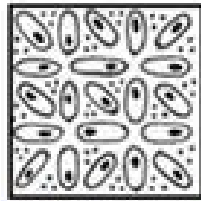




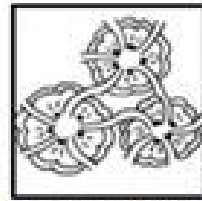

TOTALLY EASY ZENTANGLE

Grab a black *Sharpie*, a piece of *white card stock*, and something round i.e. a half-used roll of colored duct tape.

Trace circles all over the paper, overlapping some.

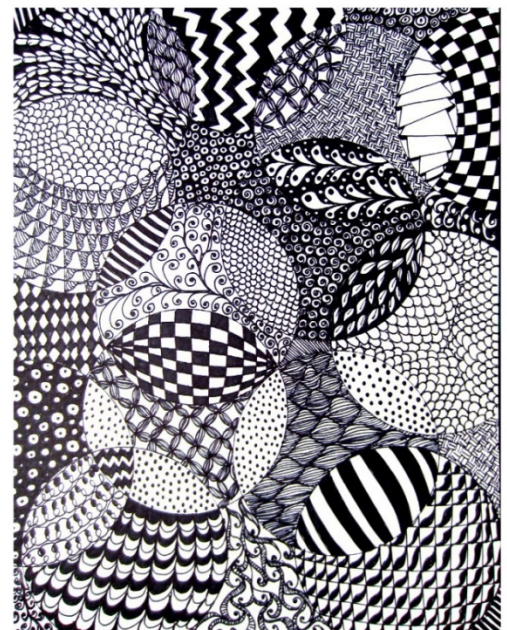
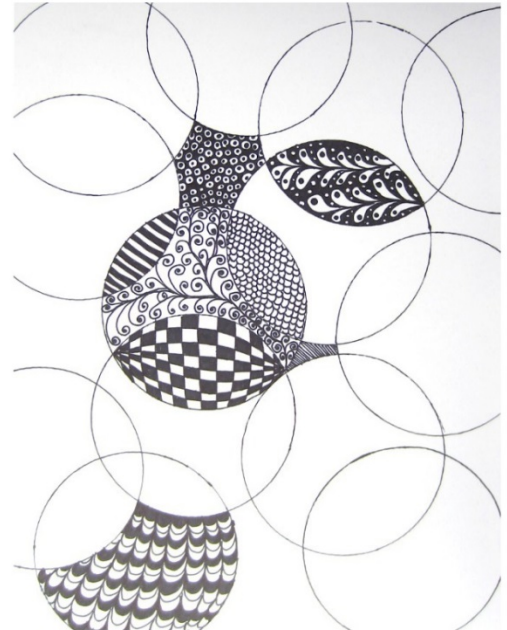
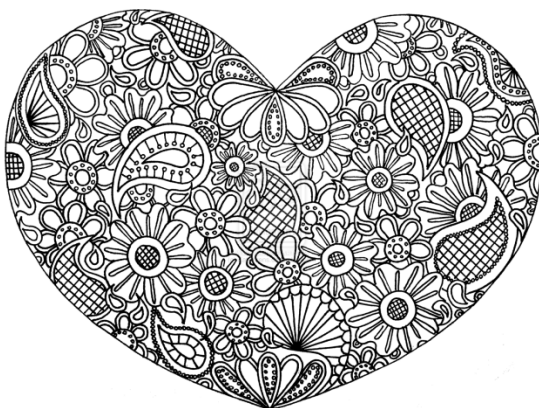
Draw patterns inside the resulting spaces. This may take a few hours to finish, so if you want to start smaller, you can either just make a few overlapping circles in the middle of the page and leave the outside of the page blank, or cut your paper in half.



Have your student trace their hand on card stock.



Or make a heart

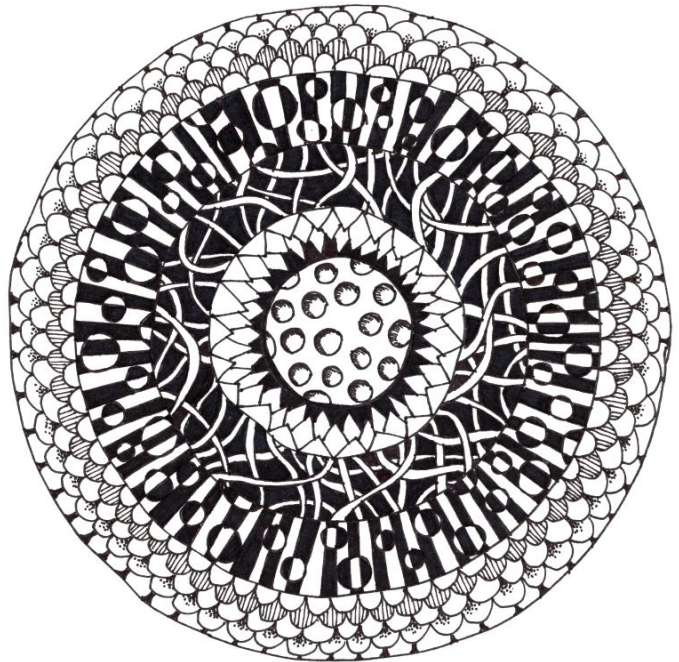
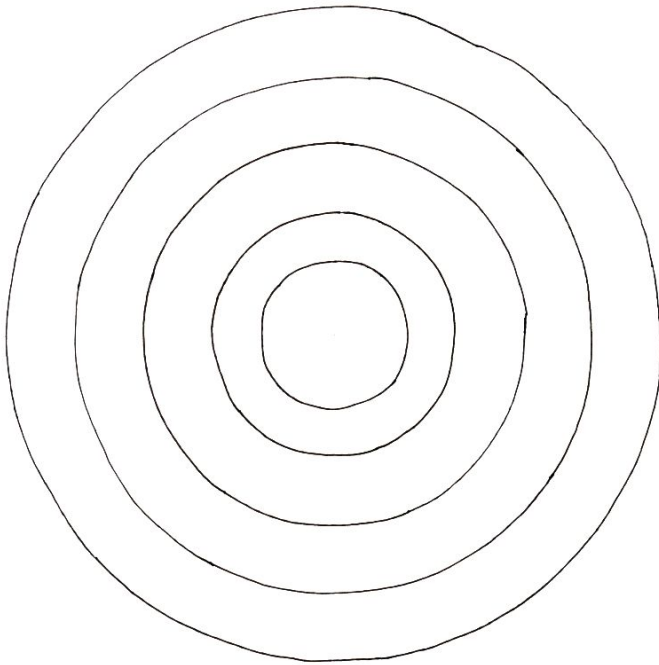


BULLSEYE TANGLE DRAWING

What you Need: Compass, White card stock, Black sharpie marker

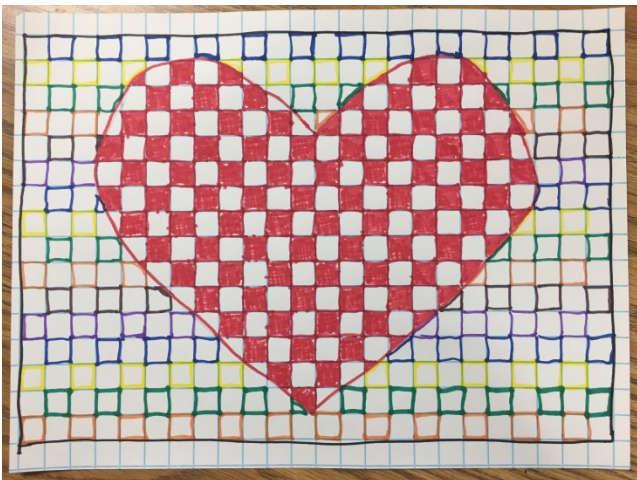
Take your compass and draw a small circle in the middle of your paper. Draw concentric circles going out.

Tips: If you don't have a compass, you can use circular objects of different sizes to draw your circles. It's just a bit trickier to figure out how to draw them evenly as you can't see through bowls. I mean, I can't. Maybe you can.
