




This is the little red hen. She lives on a farm with her children. She works hard to take care of them.



One day, the little red hen found some seeds. She had an idea. She could plant the seeds in the garden.




After a short time, the bread was done. Its scent filled the barnyard. The farm animals came running over.

Life Cycle of a Chicken






chicken laying eggs




egg hatching

A female bird lays eggs with hard shells. Most birds lay their eggs in nests to keep them safe. A parent sits on the eggs to keep them warm.

After 21 days, the chick is ready to hatch. It pecks holes in the shell and pushes itself out. Its feathers are wet but they dry quickly and the chick can run about and feed itself within hours.







A baby bird is called a chick.
They hatch from the eggs and their parents bring them food and care for them until they can look after themselves.

Adult hens are ready to begin laying eggs at about 6 months. Young chickens are about 3 months old, and adult hens are ready to begin laying eggs at about 6 months.

Wheat grows in fields





Wheat is ground into flour


